E-Waste and Appliance Recycling Day:

Recycle your old electronics and appliances on September 11th from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., at the Redwood County Fairgrounds. This is for Redwood County residents only and not intended for businesses.

The cost of electronics is \$5 per item for TV's and anything with a monitor.

All other electronics (CPU's, mice, keyboards, speakers, printers, VCRs, radios, cell phones, cameras, etc. are free.

There will be no charge for microwaves, washers and dryers, refrigerators, water heaters, humidifiers, dehumidifiers, furnaces, water softeners, stoves, air conditioners, etc.

There will be a charge for RV refrigerators.

Household hazardous waste, standard recyclable materials and fluorescent bulbs will not be accepted.

Utility Bill Payment Options:

Utility customers have a number of options available to pay their utility bill. It may be mailed to City of Belview, P.O. Box 159 or it can be dropped off in the drop box outside the City Clerk's Office. If you have a checking account with MN West Bank- Belview you can have your bill automatically withdrawn from your checking account just set it up with the City Clerk. MN West Bank-Belview also accepts payments for your City of Belview utility bill.

Remember that if utility bills are past due your garbage service may be interrupted until payment is received.

Phase Two Of Tree Planting:

Thanks to the generous donations received this last year the City Council approved the next phase of tree planting. Thirty five trees will be planted throughout town with all of the funds coming from donations. There are 7 different varieties that are going to be planted. The locations of the various varieties will be determined by the nursery in part by the existing trees located nearby. We were advised to plant a variety of trees verses planting too many of one species. Two quotes were received for the trees this year and the City Council awarded the contract to the Redwood Nursery. The plan is to get them planted prior to Old SOD Day.

A blue spruce is also being planted north of the Odeon Hall and will be decorated each year at Christmas. This tree was paid for from donations received for copies of the DVD "365 Days of Belview." A photo project by Lori Ryer which was done last year.

Special thanks to all of the property owners that purchased and planted trees on the boulevard by their homes at their own expense. Most of these property owners checked with the City on the placement and variety of tree before they planted and that was really appreciated as some varieties are better suited for boulevards and under overhead wires.

Next year we hope to plant additional trees as funds become available.

If you are planning on planting trees this fall anywhere on your property make sure that a Gopher Locate is done prior to digging.
